
## **Cardboard Cowboys**

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## New books, extra funding and author events!



We were delighted last term when £8,150 was awarded to Eyemouth High School from the 'Scottish Government School Improvement Fund.' The fund, administered by Scottish Library and Information Council (SLIC), will benefit

primary and secondary students in our area.

Funds for school libraries were awarded to projects championing anti-racism and anti-discrimination. The Eyemouth project, 'Get Woke' aims to expand the knowledge and understanding of our students around issues including diversity and anti-racism.

Anne Renstead, School Librarian and Laura Feeney, PT English and Literacy, have already selected and ordered stock for the school library. All learners from P6-S3 will be taught a novel with an anti-racist/inclusive theme. These has been collaboratively across the cluster. Mrs Feeney and Mr Fryer from Eyemouth Primary will be working with class teachers to develop skills for Literacy as well as an awareness of issues. We are really excited to help our pupils become more aware and understanding around issues that will make us all more "woke".





All S1 and S2 pupils are using Accelerated Reader, a web based tool which targets books at just the right level for readers. Once a book has been finished, you can take a quiz and accrue points. We have an in school competition, "Quiz Wars". The class with the most quizzes passed gets an end of term treat! 511 quizzes were passed between August and February. Please encourage your young person to read at home every day and to quiz when they finish a book. They will always have a book from our amazing school library and regular reading is one of the best things you can do to help your progress in every subject, as well as being good for your wellbeing.
