



Opportunities with STEM across the curriculum







On Monday 6th November all S3 students were invited to attend the **Edinburgh Science Festival Careers Hive** event at the National Museum in Edinburgh to learn about careers in STEM subjects. The day started with a talk from scientists about their career journeys including how one presenter went from Rugby to Quantity Surveying and another had set up her own online bespoke knitting business! In the afternoon students explored how their skills could be applied to STEM careers, and also had a chance to talk with a wide range of STEM professionals through taking part in activities. Some highlights included building an engine, VR space travel, keyhole surgery, upside down glasses, and programming robots!



On the 16th November our **Advanced Higher Physics students** attended Heriot-Watt University to access specialist equipment to complete their Advanced Higher practical projects.



On the 8th November eight students attended the **`S2 Girls Into Physics'** event run by the Institute of Physics – they were able to operate the bronchoscope and experiment with UV beads.
