

EXPECTATIONS OF STUDENTS

Behaviour during the school day

- Follow instructions of all members of staff.
- Be polite and courteous to all members of staff and to each other.
- Respect the school building and resources we have in it.

Some specific expectations

- Be on time for all classes.
- Walk quietly around the building at all times don't run.
- Don't leave litter anywhere in the building or grounds.
- Before school and at intervals, S1-3 students should go outside or use the canteen/social areas - being in other areas of the school is an S4-6 student privilege.
- During class times and at transitions between classes, mobile phones should be switched off and put away - only if a teacher has given permission to you are they allowed to be used at these times.

ALL ABOUT A PASTORAL TEACHER

What does a Pastoral teacher do?

A Pastoral teacher is a teacher in the school who acts as a link between you, your teachers and your parents. Your Pastoral teacher will come to know you well and will usually remain as your Pastoral teacher throughout your time in this school. You will get to know them well, too!

Your Pastoral teacher is responsible for trying to help you with any problems which might have an effect on your schooling.

Your Pastoral teacher is also responsible for providing advice on careers as you progress through school, e.g. advice about Choice of Subjects when appropriate.

Your Pastoral teacher is responsible for generally keeping an eye on you, supporting you in getting the most out of your time in school here.

Who is my Pastoral teacher?

At Eyemouth High School we have two universal Pastoral staff called Mrs McSwan and Mrs Milne. We also have a third Pastoral teacher, Mrs Black, who will work with targeted students. If you are a targeted student this will be discussed with you and your parents.

How often does the Pastoral teacher see you?

The school's Personal and Social Education programme is taught by your Pastoral teacher (unless you are a targeted student, where you will be taught with the rest of your class with a Universal Pastoral Teacher). This means that you will see them in class for one period every week (in PSE).

In addition, there is a programme of one to one interviews which means that you will meet with them individually.

However, you are strongly advised to approach your Pastoral teacher at any other time if you feel that she can be of help.

You can find a Pastoral Teacher by:

- Completing the "Pastoral self-referral" form found on the Home Section of the School website. On receiving the request your Pastoral Teacher will arrange to see you.
- If it is urgent then speak to a teacher or the member of staff on Duty at break or lunch, who will direct you to support.

THERE WILL BE A MEMBER OF THE PUPIL SUPPORT TEAM AVAILABLE IN THE PASTORAL AREA EACH MORNING INTERVAL AND LUNCHTIME.

How come I get this particular Pastoral teacher?

Wherever possible, the school tries to keep families together. This means that, normally, brothers and sisters will have the same Pastoral teacher. It is important to point out that this is not always possible.

What about confidentiality

Your Pastoral teacher will often have to deal with sensitive issues. Anything that is told (e.g. to do with your health or background) will be treated in the strictest confidence. Pastoral staff work closely with the school nurse who can help with advice on health/medical issues. All staff have a duty of care and may have to discuss these concerns with the Child Protection Coordinator should they have real worries about your safety.

Role of the Home School Link Worker

Eyemouth High School has two Home School Link Workers. Mrs McNeil, who has responsibility for attendance, transitions and linking with home where necessary. She is also a point of contact if you are worried or concerned about anything. Ms Simm, Home School Link Worker for the Cluster Primaries and Eyemouth High School, who has responsibility for Links with Primary Schools, early intervention and transitions.

WHAT DO I DO IF...?

This section of the booklet helps you to decide what to do if certain things happen to you.

What do I do if the bus does not turn up in the morning?

Wait at the bus stop for 15 minutes. If the bus still does not turn up, then return home.

What do I do if I miss the bus home in the evening?

Do not attempt to walk or hitch home. Go to the school office and one of the office staff will contact your parents and make arrangements to get you home.

What do I do if I lose my bus pass?

Obviously, look for it first. Go to the school office and you will be given a temporary bus pass. If after a few days you still have not found the pass, then you must let the office know, they will add a request for payment of £5 on your ParentPay account for a Replacement Bus Pass, once this has been paid, they will send for a permanent replacement. Remember you must return the temporary pass to the office. Do not travel on a bus without a pass.

What do I do if I forget my dinner money?

If you cannot go home for lunch you must go to the school office where staff will make contact with home and make arrangements to have your ParentPay account topped up or cash brought into school.

What do I do if I am not feeling well?

Do not go home without permission. We will not know what has happened to you if you do. If you feel unwell in a class then tell your teacher. Your teacher will decide what to do to help you. If you feel unwell during the morning interval or at lunchtime then <u>report to the office</u>. The office staff will get help for you. If you are unable to continue at school then <u>we will inform your parents</u> and arrange to get you home.

Do not worry about it. Everyone knows how it feels and will help you. Ask a friend in the same class, or any older student, or any member of staff for help. In the first few weeks of school there will also be Senior students supporting new S1 students as part of the First Year Friends programme. Show them your timetable. If you cannot find anyone to ask then go to the office.

What do I do if I lose my timetable?

Get a copy from a friend, take a photo on your iPad, or phone if you have one, or go to the office and the office staff will give you a copy.

What do I do if I am being bullied?

The school takes this very seriously. If someone bullies you then you must tell a teacher right away. The best person to tell is your Pastoral Teacher. What you must not do is keep the fact that you are being bullied to yourself. What you say will be treated very seriously and in confidence. Do not be afraid to tell.

What do I do if something is lost or stolen?

Ask permission to check the classrooms you have been in during the day. If you still have not found it then ask at the office to see if it has been handed in. You should not leave your possessions lying around unattended. You must also make sure that your locker is always locked.

What do I do if I am going to be absent?

If you are going to be absent you must ask your parent/carer to either send a text via Groupcall Xpressions or telephone the Absence Line (018907 50464) by 9am at the latest and leave a message on the answering machine giving the reason for your absence. Your parent/carer must contact the school to explain your absence <u>each day you are not in school</u> unless they have already given the length of time you are likely to be absent. The Absence Line is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, to leave a message.

First of all you should try to arrange such appointments out with school hours. If this is not possible then you should bring a letter from your parent or an appointment card. Take your letter or card to the office where you will be given a permission slip. Show this slip to your class teacher when you need to leave. Go to the office as you leave the school and show your slip to the office staff, <u>then sign out. When you return to school sign in at the office.</u>

What do I do if I am late?

You must sign the late sheet at the school office on arrival, then go straight to the appropriate class. If you are later than 9:30am your parent/carer must contact the school via Groupcall Xpressions or the Absence Line or you must bring a note from them to explain why you are late. If you are consistently late this will be brought to the attention of the Senior Leadership Team who may take further action.

What should I do if I am unable to take PE?

If you think you are unable to take PE then you must bring a letter from home to explain the problem and show this to your PE teacher.

Where can I go during morning interval and at lunchtime?

Canteen


Outside

At morning interval you must stay on school grounds. In S1, you must stay on school grounds at lunchtimes too until Christmas.

You will no doubt be becoming much more confident with how to support your learning using your iPad. Teaching staff at Eyemouth High School are continuing to find ways to develop digital literacy throughout their classes as part of the exciting and ground breaking "Inspire Learning" project which has been rolled out across the Scottish Borders. The aims of the project are:

- To improve access to digital technology for learners
- To ensure digital technology is an important consideration in all areas of the curriculum and is used to enhance learning and teaching experiences
- To develop the skills and confidence of learners in the appropriate use of digital technology
- To empower staff and students

What do I do if I have difficulty with my homework?

Ask your teacher <u>before</u> it is due to be handed in. There are also lunchtime homework clubs.

What if I have something that I do not want to tell a teacher?

If at times you feel you would like to speak to someone who is not a teacher – not even your Pastoral teacher – you can make an appointment with the school nurse. It is important that you share your difficulty/problem with someone you trust and feel comfortable with. She can be contacted directly at the medical room, next to the Pastoral Department on the ground floor or through your pastoral teacher or the school office. The school nurse, Mrs Fairbairn, also has a 'Drop-in' on Thursday lunchtimes where you can go for a chat or ask for advice. THIS IS A CONFIDENTIAL SERVICE. The school nurse may also see you at other times to check routine growth or height/weight or help with a health topic during PSE.

Support for Helping your Child with Homework:

As your child moves into a new school there will be new challenges ahead for them and perhaps for you in terms of supporting them with their homework.

Not only is there support available from each department within the school for you and your child, there is also support specifically for adults available at Eyemouth Community Centre.

If you would like to improve your skills to enable you to better support your child you can contact Sandra Millar. Sandra offers free, confidential help to adults who wish to brush up their reading, writing or number skills. This support is on an informal basis. MORE INFORMATION

Registration

Registration takes place **every morning at 8:50am** and it is very important that you attend on time every day. In order to help you do this there is a warning bell at 8:45am. This is a signal for you to make sure you go to your locker to put away or pick up anything you need. Coats should be left in your locker as you will not be allowed to wear them during the course of the day (except if you are going outside during morning interval/lunchtimes). You should not arrive at school before 8:30am.

Daily Sheet

Each morning during registration the announcements will be read to you from the Daily Sheet. This may tell you about meetings of teams and clubs, about an Assembly, remind you about holidays etc. In case you miss the announcement, a copy of the Daily Sheet can be found on the pillar in the canteen outside the main office. You should also keep your eye on the various notice boards around the school where a lot of information of interest to students is posted.

Canteen

The school has a canteen which serves a variety of breakfast items, snacks, drinks and lunches. You should queue at morning interval and lunch in an orderly fashion. Please remember that you must take dirty dishes etc. and place on the trays in the trolleys. Your table should be clean before you leave. If you spill anything on the table you must ask one of the Canteen Staff for a cloth and clean it. Please remember to place any rubbish in the bins provided in the Canteen area. The school operates a cashless catering system this can be added to using ParentPay - the online payment system. If you have already used this system in the Primary you will be issued with a NEW activation code to be used in the High School.

You should make sure that no food is taken around school at any time, and is finished in the Canteen.

Fusion App – You are able to pre-order lunches through the app. You will be issued with an onboarding code to access the app when you start at Eyemouth High School.

Student Lockers

We have enough lockers for everybody to have one. There is no charge for this, but students will be responsible for any damage to their locker. Students must supply their own padlock - the hook of this should be no more than 5mm in diameter. Please remember to keep your locker locked.

Library

We have an excellent library in the school, and you will be told how to join it. You will be able to use the library during some class lessons. You will also be able to use the library on various intervals and lunchtimes depending on year group. The library is open until 4pm Monday to Thursday and 1:30pm on a Friday. The library will be closed for lunch Monday to Thursday from 12:00pm – 12:45pm. Please make use of it. If there is a book you would like but the library does not have it then inform Mrs Renstead, the Librarian, and she will try to order it for you.

Young Scot Card

You will need your Young Scot Card to purchase food in the school canteen and also in the library to check out books etc.

If you lose or damage your card or want to add on Free Bus Travel, please apply online via www.getyournec.scot (Please note that Free Bus Travel is only available to students whose permanent residential address is in Scotland).

Dress Code

What is our dress code? For all students, school dress code is:

- Smart black trousers or skirt (not tracksuit material, not faded or ripped, not shorts or leggings unless worn with a skirt)
- Plain white or black collared shirt
- School tie
- School Blazer or Black school jumper or cardigan with school badge
- No Hoodies or outside coats to be worn in the school
- Black or Brown footwear

Jumpers and cardigans with the school badge are available to order directly from Border Embroideries, My Clothing or Fantasy Prints (please see next page for further details).

Scottish Borders Council has made it clear that the following categories of clothing are unacceptable in any of their schools in any circumstances:

- 1. Clothes which could cause health or safety difficulties for the wearer or others (e.g. clothes with a flammability warning).
- 2. Clothes which cause damage to the school (e.g. certain types of shoes).
- 3. Clothes which could lead to indiscipline or poor behaviour (e.g. clothing associated with particular sporting factions or teams).
- 4. Clothing which could cause offence to others in the school as a result of wording or pictures (e.g. certain t-shirts with explicit pictures or slogans and clothes which are too revealing, tight or short).
- 5. Clothing which encourages the use of alcohol, tobacco or drugs.

No student will be allowed to wear such clothes in school, and you are asked to ensure that your son/daughter complies with this requirement.

Each year, a new Head Team is selected by students and staff. The Head Team take a leading role in many aspects of school life and meet regularly with school staff.

Student Participation – Student Voice

At Eyemouth High School, we believe that it is very important to hear the student voice. We encourage participation and decision-making by students through individuals who are nominated by their peers in every class. They meet once a month within their Houses. They feedback the thoughts, issues and concerns of their classes. The House Captains then take this feedback and action to the appropriate people and communication lines are kept open between staff and students.

First Year Friends

As part of your transition to Eyemouth High School you will be supported by senior students who have volunteered as First Year Friends to help you to settle in. They will be a friendly face that you can use to help you find your way around, give you advice, help and support when you might need it.

Additional Support

There are Additional Needs Assistants who help in the classrooms. Most of the time these adults work in classes with subject teachers. The benefits of having Additional Needs Assistants are:

- you can ask either the class teacher or the Additional Needs Assistant if you don't understand the question or instructions
- you don't have to wait long to have your work corrected or checked
- if you are finding the work difficult you can ask for help there and then

Additional Needs Assistants understand that learning can be difficult for everyone at times and they have lots of suggestions and ideas to make learning easier. Support for Learning Teachers also have dedicated classes for both Numeracy & Literacy for identified students which run within the Support for Learning department & are highly supported.

If you are having problems with class work or homework, if you are worried about a test in school, you should talk to a member of the Support for Learning Department. The Support for Learning Department can be found in the Pupil Support corridor on the ground floor, along from the main office, next to the Pastoral Department.

The Learning Zone is situated in the Pupil Support corridor. There may be times when you need extra support with your learning or health & wellbeing outside of the classroom – this is where you would receive the support you need.

Each student should bring the following essential equipment: -

- 1. iPad (charged to at least 50%)
- 2. A school bag
- 3. A pencil, black and blue pen, ruler, sharpener and eraser
- 4. It is essential to carry a 2B pencil for both Art and History, an HB pencil is too hard for Art
- 5. Young Scot Card
- 6. Scientific Calculator (may be purchased from school office £4.15)
- 7. Bus Pass if you need one
- 8. For PE the following is essential: -

When students are involved in **indoor work**, they should bring a T-shirt, shorts, sports socks and trainers. Indoor footwear should be clean and must have non marking soles. Black and coloured soled trainers are permitted provided they are non-marking and they have 'Non Marking' printed on the sole or label.

For **outdoor work**, students should have a rugby shirt or sweatshirt or tracksuit (with shorts underneath), shorts or games skirt, sports socks, football or rugby boots for work on the grass pitches – trainers are appropriate but boots are more practical. On the all-weather pitch, clean trainers are required.

Students are strongly encouraged to bring a complete change of clothes and footwear for PE for obvious hygiene reasons. It is also recommended that students bring a towel so that they can have a shower immediately after their activity. For safety reasons all jewellery is removed for every lesson.

Reminder – as described in Scottish Borders Council policy on dress, sports clothing should have no offensive slogans or advertising of alcohol, tobacco or drugs.

Quarriers

Quarriers Resilience for Wellbeing Service focuses on prevention and early intervention to aid and improve emotional wellbeing and mental health. Simply put, we are here to guide and help young people to identify strategies to help them cope when times are tough.

Through one-to-one sessions, small group work and drop-in sessions, Quarriers Resilience for Wellbeing Service supports young people to look at what is going on in their lives and address the emotional challenges and barriers they face.

Groupcall Xpressions App information for parents

Groupcall Xpressions is a new way for you to view messages from your child's school through an App on your mobile phone or tablet.

It will be available to all parents with children at Borders schools and will make communication between you and the school easier and more effective.

It will be delivered by Groupcall and will work alongside the existing system. Text alerts will be used for any urgent messages, while all others will be sent using the new App or Groupcall email.

What are the benefits?

- The App is completely free of charge to you • and can be installed on your mobile phone or tablet. It currently supports both Apple iOS and Android devices. You can also login via a web browser at: https://xpressions.groupcall.com
- If you have children in different schools and ٠ those schools also use Groupcall Xpressions, you will be able to view information about each of them within the same App.
- The App shows a timeline of messages/ • message history from your child/children's schools and is a convenient way of keeping all your school messages in one place.
- Messages can include attachments such as school newsletters, saving your school time and money.



How can I start using the App?

Groupcall has set up the system for your school to use. All you need do is:

- Search for Groupcall Xpressions in your App store. It can be downloaded from either the iOS or Android store.
- Once installed, you can login using the email and mobile number stored against your child's school record.
- You can then access the system and receive messages.

Please make sure we have your correct mobile number and email address on our school database to ensure you can access the App.
