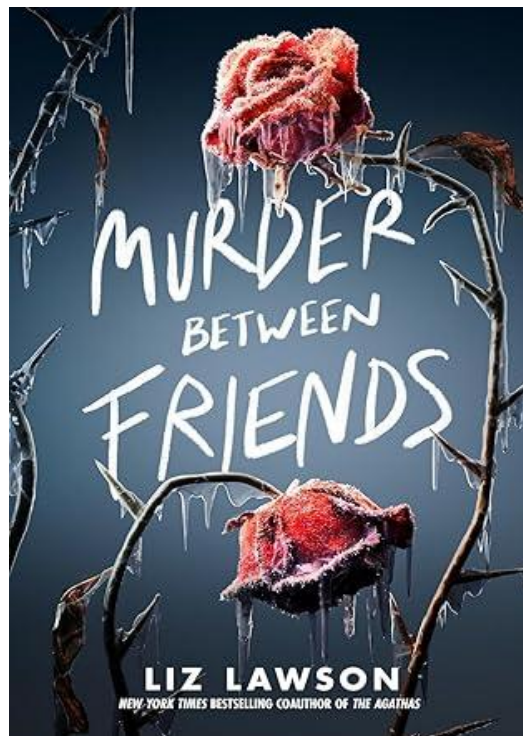


Looking for your next read?

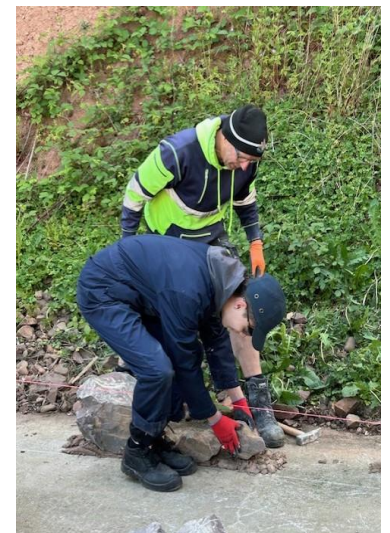


Pupils at work
